# Youth Now 2016-2017





Youth Now is designed to harness the leadership potential found in our community by training young adults to serve as board members for local non-profit organizations. The program is open to high school graduates under the age of 26 who live, work, or study in Richmond.

There are two distinct components to the Youth Now program: 1) a leadership development component for **youth** who are looking to make an impact in their community; and 2) an opportunity for **non-profit organizations** to strengthen their boards through the infusion of younger community leaders

Leadership Richmond – Youth Now includes training for both the young adults and non-profit organizations participating in the program. Youth Now leaders develop their leadership skills, along with their understanding of the roles that boards of directors fill and the benefits of being involved as a community leader. Organizations learn how to strengthen their boards by involving youth as full participants and mentoring them through the program.
