The program is open to high school graduates under the age of 26 who live, work, or study in Richmond.

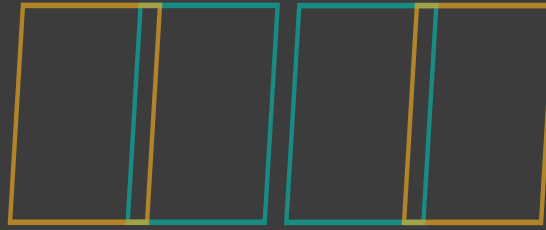
What is involved?
